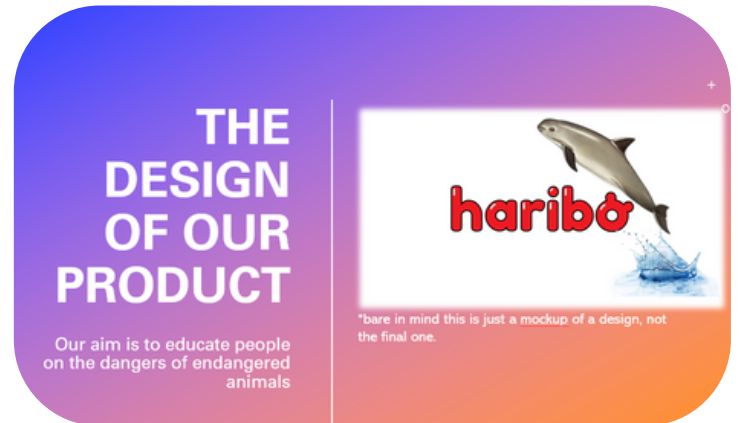
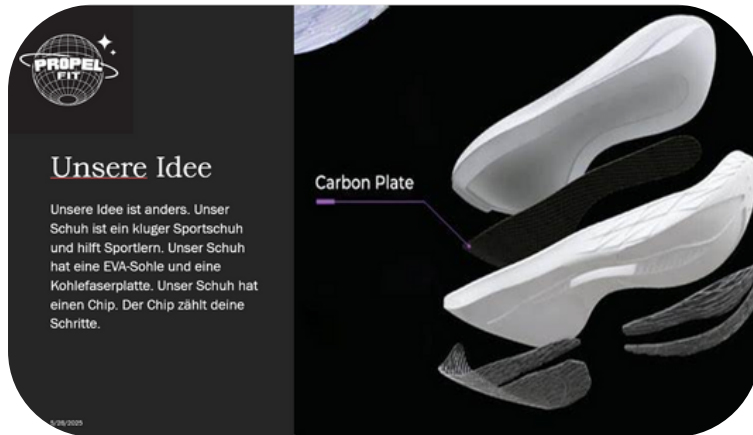
Year 8 have been performing their Billy Elliot scenes.

This year we have had so many girls wanting to play in the netball team the girls have had to rotate around on a weekly basis to allow game time.

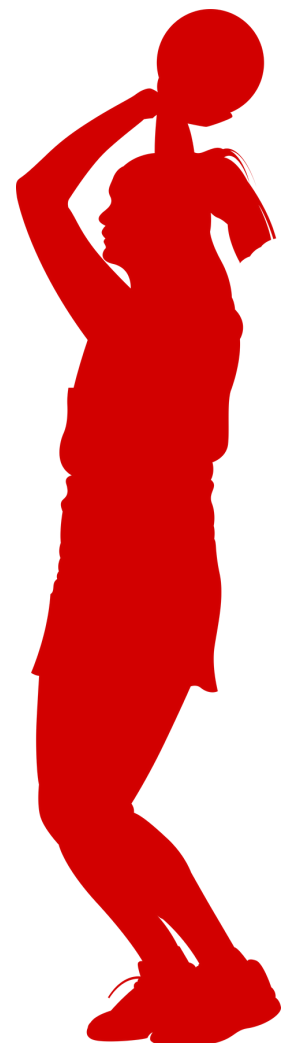
The girls secured the win and are District winners!! Player of the match was chosen by Weavers and they awarded it to Keziah who had a great game as Wing Defence.
